### 2. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

The SRWA is continually looking for alternative funding sources, mainly grants, to fund construction of the Regional Surface Water Supply Project (Project). The 2021 Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Grant Program offered by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) provides grants for projects offering long-term drought relief. With support from the SRWA program manager, West Yost, the General Manager submitted an application for \$7.44 million in grant funds from the Drought Relief Program in November 2021. The specific project elements in the application include the raw water pump station, raw water flow split structure, chemical storage and feed building and water treatment acceptance testing. To be eligible for a funding agreement, DWR requires a resolution from the governing body of SRWA authorizing the submission of the application and the authority to enter into an agreement with DWR if awarded funding.

### 3. FISCAL IMPACT/BUDGET AMENDMENT:

The Drought Relief funding request is for \$7,440,000. If awarded, this funding will reduce the State Revolving Fund loan amount by the same amount, reducing SRWA's debt and ultimately reducing the final project cost.

### 1. ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Resolution: Terminate U.S. Bureau of Reclamation Grant Assistance

Agreements under WaterSMART Drought Response

Program

#### 2. **DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:**

On March 28, 2019, the Board authorized a WaterSMART water and energy efficiency grant application to the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation). SRWA was subsequently awarded two WaterSMART grant assistance agreements (Reclamation agreement nos. R19AP00104 & R20AP00110), each in the amount of \$750,000 and executed those grant agreements on April 10<sup>th</sup> and July 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2020. Each grant agreement requires that SRWA agree to comply or assist Reclamation with all regulatory compliance requirements and all applicable state, Federal, and local environmental and cultural and paleontological resource protection laws, including NEPA. The grant agreements include a project milestone schedule which indicates complete environmental and cultural compliance as a milestone with a planned completion date of February 2021. SRWA relied on this schedule, approved the grant agreements, and proceeded with the design-build contract construction.

Reclamation did not complete the environmental work by the February 2021 milestone in the agreements and still has not completed the work. Delaying project construction while awaiting environmental review would have put SRWA at significant risk to project cost inflation and a potential design-build contract delay claim that probably would have exceeded the amount of these grants. SRWA therefore commenced project construction prior to Reclamation's still uncompleted environmental work. This sequence of events and Reclamation's delay now make SRWA ineligible for funding under the grant agreements. Additionally, the new federal environmental review could lead to additional conditions and mitigation measures being imposed on the project that could be costly or burdensome to implement. Consequently, SWRA staff recommends that the Authority terminate these agreements.

### 3. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

The total amount of grant funds available to SRWA from the two agreements is \$1,478,444.00. Terminating these grant agreements will require SRWA to make up this amount from other available project funds in the form of cash or borrowed through the State Revolving Fund loan project cost reconciliation process.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Board of the Stanislaus Regional Water Authority ("Board") as follows:

- 1. Recitals. This resolution is adopted with reference to the following background recitals:
- a. In 2020, Stanislaus Regional Water Authority (SRWA) approved two financial assistance (grant) agreements with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) under the WaterSMART Water and Energy Efficiency Grant program totaling \$1.5 million (Reclamation agreement nos. R19AP00104 & R20AP00110; the "Agreements").
- b. The Agreements are subject to provisions that require Reclamation to comply with applicable environmental and cultural protection laws before it will release grant funding. The project milestone schedule in the Agreements provides that Reclamation would complete the environmental and cultural compliance work by February 2021. This date was consistent with SRWA's project construction schedule. SRWA therefore relied on this schedule, approved the Agreements, and proceeded with work under the design-build contract.
- c. Reclamation did not complete the environmental and cultural work by February 2021 and, as of the date of this resolution, still has not completed the work. Reclamation therefore failed to timely and diligently undertake and complete the environmental review within the planned completion date in the Agreements.
- d. To remain eligible for grant funding, the Agreements would have required SRWA to delay the start of project construction until after Reclamation completed its environmental review. Doing so would have resulted in project construction delay and consequent project cost inflation and a contract delay claim under the design-build contract, which probably would have exceeded the grant funding. SRWA therefore made the prudent decision to proceed with project construction on the planned construction schedule. This sequence of events and Reclamation's delay now make SRWA ineligible for grant funding under the Agreements. SRWA therefore now desires to terminate the Agreements for the reasons set forth below.

- e. Part II, section 9(a)(4) of the Agreements and Code of Federal Regulations title 2, section 200.340 authorize SRWA to terminate the Agreements by sending to the federal awarding agency (Reclamation) written notification of termination setting forth the reasons for the termination and the effective date.
- 2. Grant Termination. The Authority terminates the Agreements. The General Manager is directed to send this resolution to Reclamation as written notification of termination.
- 3. Reasons. The Authority terminates the Agreements for the following reasons:
- a. Reclamation did not complete the environmental and cultural work by the milestone completion date in the Agreements, which SRWA relied on when it approved the Agreements. It would have been imprudent and costly for SRWA to delay project construction to accommodate Reclamation's delay. SRWA therefore has no practical choice but to terminate the Agreements since it no longer is eligible for funding under them.
- b. As a condition to providing grant funding, Reclamation determined that it would need to undertake additional environmental review under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) regarding project operations. These federal NEPA and ESA reviews and determinations could lead to additional conditions and mitigation measures being imposed on the SRWA project as a condition of grant funding, which could be costly or burdensome to implement or could impose long-term constraints, ongoing compliance measures, or other obligations on project operations. The risk, uncertainty, and potential cost of the NEPA and ESA reviews and related potential burdensome conditions also support termination of the Agreements.
- 4. Effective Date. The effective date of the Agreements termination is January 20, 2022.
